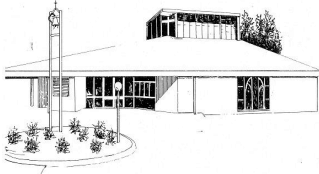

The Most Holy Trinity — Year C 16 June 2019

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON:
He fed them with the finest wheat and satisfied them
with honey from the rock.

FIRST READING: GENESIS 14:18-20
Melchizedek Brought bread and wine.
RESPONSORIAL PS: PSALM 109:1-4
You are a priest for ever, in the line of Melchizedek.

SECOND READING: 1 CORINTHIANS 11:23-26
*Every time you eat this bread and drink this cup, you are
proclaiming the death of the Lord.*

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION:
Alleluia, alleluia! I am the living bread from heaven,
says the Lord; whoever eats this bread will live for ever.

GOSPEL: LUKE 9:11-17
They all ate and were filled.

COMMUNION ANTIPHON:
Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in
me and I in him, says the Lord.

REFLECTIONS ON THE READING...
Jesus said to his apostles: 'Do this in
memory of me.' We all love to be
remembered. This was true even for
Jesus. But if we want to be
remembered, we have a duty also to
remember. Memory is a powerful thing.
Wrongly used it brings death; rightly
used it brings life, and is a form of immortality. It keeps
the past alive. Those we remember never die; they con-
tinue to walk and talk with us. Lord, when we
celebrate the Eucharist we are remembering you.
May that remembering bring us life here and hereafter.



Reflection - The Most Holy Trinity...

*The "Three" whom we celebrate today is never an "arithmetic" three. When we try to understand something of the
mystery of the oneness of the Trinity, we often grasp at symbols.*
*The church keeps this solemnity in order to shine some enlightening sun into the gap of our understanding of the deep
wisdom of God, invisibly rising in our lives through the power of the Spirit, and enabling us to burst through death into
the new life that the Son won for us from the sealed tomb. This is expressed in the mystery of communion and
friendship of the One in Three Persons whom we call the Trinity. We mark our foreheads with the sign of the cross and
name the Three Persons so often, but does anything of their mystery plow its significance into our hearts?*
*At the beginning of our Christian lives, at baptism, we are named for them; at the beginning and end of each Eucharist
we sign ourselves with their memory; when our bodies are signed in death, we hope they claim us; when we bless our
children, we remember the creativity the Trinity shares with us.*
*All these moments of naming the Trinity are occasions of life and love. When we are blessed "in the name of,"
we are incorporated into the personal history of the one named. The sign of the cross and the invocation of the Trinity,
a prayer of gesture and words that we learned in childhood, are a simple yet profound statement that we belong to
Father, Son and Holy Spirit and are called to live in communion with them.*

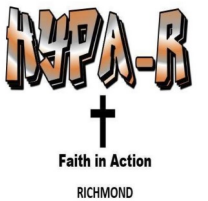

UPDATE FROM THE ST MONICA'S ADVOCACY GROUP FOR REFUGEES AND THOSE SEEKING ASYLUM

We thought it important to share some of experiences of the group since formation and give you insight into some of the upcoming opportunities also. Firstly, on behalf of the St Monica's Parish, we completed and submitted the petition to the Federal Government advocating for the immediate release of all children from Nauru and Manus islands. Again the parish responded to the need to contribute to the refugee food bank and we were able to deliver ten full baskets of household goods to the refugee centre at Westmead. Several of us were involved in the Circle of Silence protest at Windsor, joining with the Hawkesbury RAR and bringing to the fore the plight of those who have lost their lives while in detention. Several fruitful conversations were able to take place as a result of this protest. Last weekend we attended a retreat and reflection day at Mulgoa with Bishop Vincent. We listened to various speakers who work with refugees and we were energised by talks from the head of JRS and by those who work on a daily basis with those seeking asylum, all in an attempt to spread the gospel message. In conjunction with the Rural Australians for Refugees we invite you to a movie night next Tuesday the 18th of June at 7pm at Windsor library. The Merger is a 2018 Australian movie. The cost of the evening is \$5 per person and the donations received go towards the support of a refugee family in the Blue Mountains.

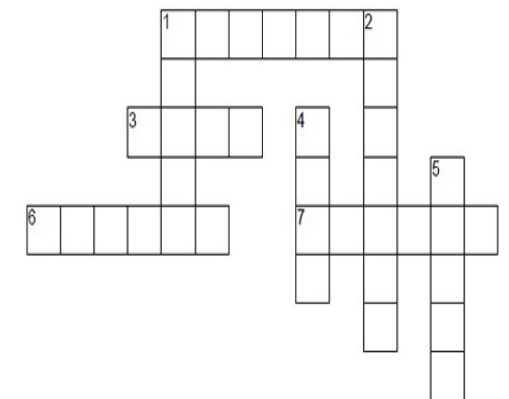
