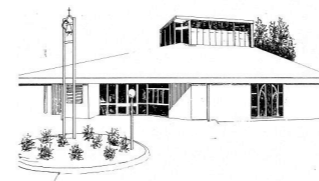

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Sunday 2019

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Sunday falls on the first Sunday in July and is a significant celebration on our Church's calendar. Whilst providing us with an opportunity to acknowledge our Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander brothers and sisters, the celebration also signifies that we are united as one in God's love and care.



As a community we must strengthen the observance of the Lord's Day especially in the worship of God at Sunday Mass. This year, on July 7, I encourage you to you utilise the Liturgical resources provided by the National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Catholic Council (NATSICC) for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Sunday and, renewed by the strength of God's love, I pray the Liturgy will lead you, your Parish, school or organisation to mission.

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Catholics number over 130,000 and are a growing demographic in our Church today. We must continue to reach out and provide opportunities where we may be enriched and nourished by their deep spirituality, culture and love for Jesus Christ by open the doors to our hearts and our homes.

In the Gospel of the day Jesus says "The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field." Just as Jesus did, we must meet people where they are and walk alongside our First Nation's peoples on their journey to reconciliation and justice.

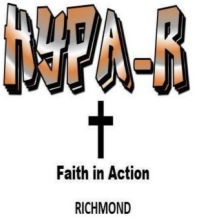

Music Ministry.. Please note that those interested in assisting with singing at any Mass, in any one of the three Mass centres, are encouraged to come to **Choir Practice each Wednesday evening from 7pm to 8pm at St Monica's.** We hope this hour can be a great way to keep informed about all the Parish happenings in terms of music, to revise known hymns and to learn new hymns.

Ministers of music do not perform for the entertainment of those present, but provide the accompaniment and lead **to enable the members of the assembly to sing the responses, acclamations and songs of the liturgy.** We need singers who, while attending a Mass of their choice, **can help lead the congregational singing.** Currently we have music and singing at *St John of God, St Gregory's* and at *St Monica's* Saturday evening Mass, 9.30 Sunday Mass and sometimes the 5.30pm Sunday Mass. At the 9.30am Masses, *The Kids Choir* leads on the first Sunday, *HYPAR* leads on the Saturday before the third Sunday, while the *Couples for Christ* lead the singing at the 5.30pm third Sunday Mass. **The aim is to have at least two to four singers leading the congregational singing at each Mass when we have music.** Until we get more key-board players, or instrumentalists we need to use embedded or recorded music or have no music! **PLEASE, IF YOU KNOW ANYONE WHO CAN ASSIST THIS IS A MAJOR NEED!** Young parishioners we particularly need your commitment, gifts and talents to grow this ministry! Let us support one another and our Parish by promoting this important activity.

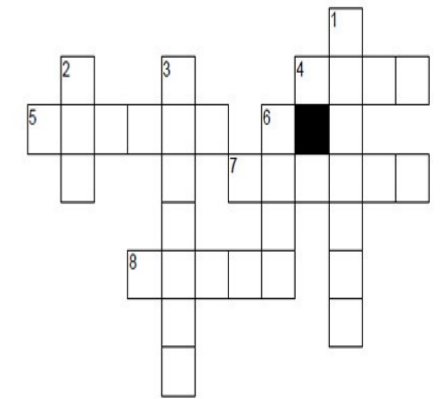
