GOSPEL: Matthew 4:1-11

REFLECTIONS ON THE READING...

The prophet Isaiah continues to address his people's false piety with an attack on their Sabbath practices. The Sabbath was a day set aside for rest in the Lord. So integral is the Sabbath that it is safeguarded by both commandment and laws. The intent is clear: rest in God. No work, no malicious speech, no personal interests. Lay it all down for a day. Renew, regroup, and relish the love and blessedness of God. What do our Sundays look like? Do we rest? Not to work seems anathema in our society. Perhaps a good Lenten discipline would be to return Sunday to its rightful place. Remember that we don't run the world, God does. We need a weekly reminder of that.

Gospel Reflection...

The story of the forbidden fruit is the protype of all temptation. The devil is the father of lies, the master of the half-truth and deception. First he plants a question in the mind, the seed of doubt. Then he shows the attractiveness of the fruit, good to eat and pleasing to the eye. The senses are attracted to the bait. Then the deception, you will be like gods, knowing good and evil, having the moral autonomy to make up their own commandments. They fell for it. Their eyes were indeed opened, not only to good, but now also to evil.

Does it match our experience of temptation?

The Spirit enrolled Jesus in the school called wilderness to prepare him for ministry. The teachers there were solitude and emptiness, vastness and space, necessity and frugality. The subject to be studied was the human heart in its temptations and supports. The three temptations link Jesus with the past history of the Israelites in the weaknesses shown and supports given by God during the Exodus journey. Lent calls us to get in touch with our inner weaknesses and sources of strength.

Obedient to God's law features in all 3 readings. The original temptation was to usurp God's authority by claiming moral autonomy: You will be like gods, knowing good and evil. Adam's disobedience brought about the fall but Christ's obedience brought redemption. Lent is a time for giving up and taking on. Why not give up all our compromises and ways of disobeying God's will: You must worship the Lord, your God, and serve him alone.


