

Anyone who does not accept his cross is not worthy of me. Anyone who welcomes you, welcomes me.

REFLECTIONS ON THE READING...

There is something of a descending order in this passage. Jesus begins with the summons of placing our love and commitment to him over and above that of our family and ourself. By the end of the passage the simplest gesture of kindness, giving a cup of cold water, retains our reward. Note that the more difficult challenges lead to receiving Jesus himself, whereas the more general practices yield a reward.. Welcoming a prophet, a righteous person, or offering cold water can be done by any conscientious person; being a follower of Jesus demands more than being a good person. It requires total allegiance to Christ.

Gospel Reflection...

The Apostolic Sermon closes with a double message. Being involved in any apostolate will put demands on our time and personal relationships: but, in God's time, it will bring a great reward.

Beware of cheap religion which bypasses the cost of discipleship. It is no surprise that a society bred on self-gratification is short of candidates to priesthood and religious life. The following of the cross is out of favour. But it is the cross which makes sense of voluntary sacrifice. Celibacy is a difficult choice but is offers a powerful witness to the serious reality of God. Anyone who finds his life will lose it; anyone who loses his life for my sake will find it.

A reward is promised to those who welcome the holy man, i.e. the bearer of God's word. (cf first reading) Encourage people to prepare a welcome for the word. Instead of criticising the poor preacher why not pray for him? Thirst for the word with the humility of knowing our need for God's light. Cherish the word which reveals God's presence in the story of the past, enabling us to see how God is present in the story of today. Mary of Bethany sat at the feet of the Lord and chose the better part.


