By this we came to know the love of God: that Christ laid down his life for us; so we ought to lay down our lives for one another.

REFLECTIONS ON THE READING...

A father had three sons. One day he said to them, 'Go and work in the vineyard today.' The first said, 'Sure, Dad.' But he didn't go. The second said, 'I wont go.' However, later in the day he changed his mind and went grudging. The third said, 'Sure, Dad.' And he went immediately and willingly.

Which of the sons will feel closest to the father at the end of the day? The third, of course. The more we do the will of God out of love, the more we will appreciate his love for us. Lord, save us from the darkness of broken promises, and help us to walk in the light of faithfulness.

Wisdom Connection

In this parable, first appearances do not account for everything. The son who behaves badly by saying no proves to be obedient in the end, and the son who behaves ever so righteously by saying yes shows himself to be woefully disobedient. The response of each son reflects a particular faith journey. Some people experience God's love and say they are going to share it with others but never do. Others resist God's love, saying no to God over and over, but later they reconsider and go on to share God's love with everyone around them. Even if our hearts and minds are open momentarily, the grace of God's forgiveness can bring about an abrupt change of direction in our lives.

This Sunday's Gospel tells us to find security in a dynamic relationship with God, not in religion. Jesus argues vehemently with people who place their trust in the things of religion—the rituals, the rules, and the security of doing what is prescribed—instead of placing their trust in the God who invites them into an intimate relationship. Jesus's words are hope-filled; we always have an opportunity to change our hearts and minds and do the will of the Father. Just as the first son takes this opportunity, we can too. After all, isn't conversion about the ability to change and follow God more closely?

Please note, one registration for one individual only. eg. A family of eight fills in eight registration forms Once the quota at each mass has been reached Google forms will not accept more bookings. In that case you may try another mass time or venue. A register of attendees for contact tracing will be at the entrance. Please sign against your name and provide your contact details. This is a legal requirement. Enjoy Mass. Remember, Communion in the hand only, not on the tongue. Let us pray for one another & our world.
