

REFLECTIONS ON THE READING...

Each year the trees give us a lesson in renewal. First the bud, then the blossom, and finally the shoot. Spring dresses the trees in a new robe, and makes them young again. But this is possible only because in autumn they let go of their



old leaves, and in between endured a period of nakedness. Lent is in the springtime of the spirit Lord, help us not to be afraid to let go of old habits, and to face our spiritual poverty, in order that you may renew us, and so at Easter we will feel young again in our discipleship.

Gospel Reflection ...

The first reading (Gen 9:8-15), an excerpt from the Noah story, points to a mythological explanation of a cosmological feature: the rainbow. That explanation is located within another mythological story about a catastrophic flood. These are among the characteristics of primitive mythologies, such as we find in Aboriginal Dreamtime stories. They often bear testimony to prehistoric earth-shaping events, such as volcanic activity, that we relative newcomers to this continent are surprised to learn about since we find it hard to imagine the land having been anything other than as we have found it. Such stories may also bear testimony to creatures long lost to extinction that we newer comers think predate human presence. The Aboriginal stories remember. The second reading is our earliest testimony to Christian use of this Noah story to understand baptism. It introduces the peculiar word, "type", used to indicate a biblical event that was later understood to have prefigured or symbolically predicted what was to come later and was openly revealed by Christ. It actually uses the Noah story not only to refer to the absolution of baptism, but also to explain how the Christ event saves those who came beforehand. In this view of the world, all things and all times are woven as one so that later events affect prior ones, and what affects one may affect all. It points to a cosmological understanding of the salvific work of Christ, and to a worldview in which humans are not separate or abstracted from the world; sin and salvation are expressed and manifested in the very stuff of creation. This worldview is hard for modern Western people to grasp at times because we have come to see ourselves as separate from and above the world; we live much of our time in our minds instead of in the world. But trying in a homily to open people to this understanding would also be a heady exercise, one that would fail with most people. We can still seek to remind congregations that things have several layers of meaning, that things reveal something of our place in the world, and that God is encountered in the material world—which is at the heart of our sacramental system. In the gospel acclamation today we hear that "No one lives on bread alone", or in the Communion antiphon that "One does not live by bread alone", and they go on to say "but on/by every word that comes (forth) from the mouth of God." But what is bread? Something you eat? Yes, yet more: it is fruit of the earth and work of human hands. To eat it is to eat the earth and to honour the work of other people. So too with wine, so too with oil, and candles, and everything we use— even water that is collected and piped. And when we are conscious of the earth and of all things coming forth by the creative power of God, then we remember that it is by God we are and live.


