DIOCESAN PASTORAL PLAN REPORT - PART 2: "BEHOLD I AM WITH YOU ALWAYS"

The plan for a synodal church was launched on 10th August 2024. A synodal church is a church that listens and "walks together" for conversion, **along with a new style of thinking, speaking & behaving.** It is a change from a more authoritarian and unidirectional formation to a more reciprocal mode. Pope Francis called in 2015 for a "Synodal church". For the pope, "a Synodal church is a church that listens!! **listening is more than simply just hearing**. It is a mutual listening in which everyone has something to learn.

The faithful people, the bishops, all listening to each other and all listening to the Holy Spirit the spirit of truth.

The synod of churches is the point of convergence of this listening process conducted at every level of the church's life.



Memorial Mass.


