LORD, LET ME SEE

Jesus spoke at length, explaining hypocrisy, and while doing so he used one image with two blind men in it: blind leading the blind. One blind man was being led, and another blind man confidently directing the first. The first blind man was honest; he accepted his impairment and was content to ask for and accept assistance. Although the second blind man was also conscious of his blindness, he was in denial. He chose to do something imprudent for a blind person to do: to lead another blind man!

Jesus did not tolerate hypocrisy because it was damaging. Our lack of honesty and humility can blind us from acknowledging the need for spiritual, physical, emotional and financial progress while confusing and misleading others. It blocks us from realising when we need help. However, just like the first blind man we can start to improve when we acknowledge our brokenness and humble ourselves. The first blind man's humility and honesty serve as a far better model of spiritual eyesight than the second blind man's denial. That's why Jesus told the Pharisees, "Take the plank out of your own eye first, and then you will see clearly enough to take out the splinter that is in your brother's eye." Healing is likely to come to the blind and honest person far sooner than to the blind and hypocritical person.

Jesus does not want us to totally forget that we need to be healed as well. Maybe we are not so broken. Perhaps we are surrounded by people who are far more broken than we are. Yet, Jesus does not want us to lose sight of the fact that you and I are also in need of healing in varying degrees. May, we not be hypocritical in identifying our blind spots.




