# The Holy Week

Today, we are moving into the Holy Week: the most solemn and sacred week in the liturgical year of the Church. Today, we have two contrasting realities to meditate on: the Messianic-kingly procession of Jesus into Jerusalem, and the certainty of suffering and death in the days to follow. It is an abrupt passage from suffering to victory and glory. Those who followed Jesus with political ambitions probably thought, "Finally, he is moving towards becoming a king." Only his mother and Jesus himself knew that finally 'the hour' had come; the hour for Him to die and rise again to new life like the wheat grain.

In God's plan, every victorious soul still bears the marks of the struggles that one endured through the battle. These marks are not stains or blemishes that resurrection cannot erase; they are reminders that our road to victory is also marked with pain, suffering and death. We would have preferred a way that would not take us through suffering, pain and doubt, because we are often struck and crushed by waves of depression, illnesses, or the departure of those whom we love. But this is the path Jesus modelled for us. Like the Holy Week, our path of discipleship is paved with many moments of suffering and confusion. As difficult as that model is, the minute we accept it, there is good news; there is hope.

Today, the Church is inviting us to walk with Jesus, starting at Bethphage, to accompany Him into the city, and to follow Him all the way with the hope of arriving at His glorious resurrection. Let us experience the life of Christ deeper by our sincere participation in the sacred liturgies of the Holy Week.

**Please note** there is no Mass at Kurrajong on Holy Saturday.






