LITURGICAL MINISTRIES

Ministers at the Altar These men and women help prepare the Altar for Celebrating the Mass and they assist the Priest in celebrating the Eucharist. Arrive 30 minutes early to prepare the Altar & Church for the Eucharistic Celebration. Ensure all rostered ministers are present. <i>Specialised</i> <i>training required.</i> WWC Registration <i>compulsory.</i>	Name of Person Participating
Junior Servers assist the Priest and <i>Ministers at the Altar</i> during Mass and various liturgical celebrations. Any young person who has received their First Communion is invited to join this ministry. Arrive 15 minutes early. Check-in with the Senior Server. <i>Specialised training required.</i>	
Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion Assist in the distribution of the Body and Blood of Christ to the assembled community at Mass and Communion Services . Arrive 10 minutes early. Check-in with the Senior Server. <i>Specialised training required</i> .	
Hospitality Ushers/greeters provide a warm welcome at the church door by distributing the Bulletin and offering information to regular parishioners and visitors. Arrive 15 minutes early to welcome people.	
Reader & Commentator Readers proclaim Scripture Readings. They carry the Book of the Gospels in the procession, & welcome the assembled community and lead the Prayers of the Faithful. Prepare the readings. Arrive 15 minutes early. Check-in with the Senior Server. Check readings and/or Commentary. <i>Specialised training necessary.</i>	
Children's Liturgy Trained men and women minister to the children by presenting the Sunday readings and Gospel to children through prayer, discussion and activities. Arrive 20 minutes early to set up meeting room. Check-in with the Senior Server. <i>Specialised training necessary.</i> WWC Registration <i>compulsory.</i>	
Children's Liturgy Coordinator During the week prior, contact rostered teachers & helpers. Ensure suitable resources are available.	
Data Projectionist This ministry involves presenting prepared PowerPoint Presentations at Liturgical celebrations. Arrive 15 minutes early for Mass & check in with the Senior Server; setup the computer and display screen in plenty of time before the celebration begins.	
Presentation of the Gifts This is an easy way for the whole family, or for individuals, to be involved in the Liturgy. Why not ask to be rostered on a day that is significant to your family eg birthdays, anniversaries? Check in with the Senior Server. Sit near the table with the gifts. How many in your group? Any special occasion (date)	
Collectors distribute collections plates, during the Mass. They show hospitality by their interaction with the assembly as they take up the collection.	
Music & Singing Ministers of music do not perform for the entertainment of those present, but provide the accompaniment and lead to enable the members of the assembly to sing the responses, acclamations and songs of the liturgy. WWC Registration compulsory. Arrive 15 minutes early. Attend choir practice as often as possible: Wed 7-8pm. CHURCH MINISTRIES			
Sacristan The duties of the sacristan are carried out under the general direction of the clergy. Duties include: wash sacred vessels & prepare for use at Masses; renew holy water, put out fresh Church linen; assist with changes required in Liturgical space.			
Preparing the Liturgical Space Help set up for special occasions such as Easter, Christmas & Sacramental Liturgies.			
Flower Arrangements Provide and/or arrange flowers for weekend liturgies and special occasions.			
Sewing Garments and mending. On occasion to assist with the repair to or sewing of garments: stoles, robes, baptism stoles, altar cloths & sacred linen.			
Church Cleaning By their 'behind the scenes work' cleaners are part of the Hospitality team. Ensure the Church is clean & well presented. Tasks include: vacuuming, dusting fixtures in the Church & foyer areas, and clean wet areas.			
Church Cleaning Coordinator: Contact with the rostered team. Oversee and support those on the cleaning roster.			
Church Linen: The respectful care of altar linen should be maintained. Rostered assistance with the regular washing of Church linen. <i>Specialised training necessary</i>			
Grounds Maintenance Assist a team to tidy the area around the church and office buildings. Tasks include weeding, sweeping, pruning as directed, removing cobwebs and cleaning external windows. Your assistance would be required as requested.			
Administration Assistance support the Parish Ministry as required with power point preparations, photocopying, general administration.

CATECHISTS strive to ensure that Catholic students attending Primary, Secondary and Special Education State schools and their families have an opportunity to hear the Good News, to develop a relationship with God and to feel welcomed and valued members of the Church community. SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION SUPPORT TEAM: Support and welcome children and families participating in the sacramental programs such as First Eucharist & Confirmation. <i>Specialised training necessary</i> . WWC Registration <i>compulsory</i> .			
BECOMING CATHOLIC: Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) Welcoming new members into our parish community is everyone's responsibility. Team member to support and welcome those participating in the RCIA.			
FAITH FORMATION: seeks to help people: Grow in their relationship with God; Live as disciples of Jesus Develop an understanding of the Bible and their faith tradition Deepen their spiritual life and practices Engage in service and mission to the world Participate in the life and ministries of their faith community.			

COMMUNITY BUILDING & OUTREACH				
Pastoral Care of the Sick Pastoral Carers attend one of five nursing homes in the Hawkesbury, while others				
visit people in their homes. This is an important ministry involving contact with the sick, the frail and the				
elderly in the Parish of Richmond. Visits take place at a mutually convenient time. Pastoral Care Volunteers				
have a formation program & a mentoring & support structure. Specialised training necessary. WWC Registration				
& Police Check Registration compulsory.				
Circle of Friends is a group of seniors who meet once a month for companionship & fun. Help is needed to help with some frail elderly.				
Ministry of Youth (HYPA-R) Our young people are our future parishioners! The Parish of Richmond is in				
need of vibrant and active Young Adult Youth Leaders who are prepared to help our Youth Group in their				
activities all year round. This ministry needs to be developed . The youth gatherings usually take the form of games and activities with time given to prayer and reflection. We need a group of enthusiastic older youth				
and adults to help with this ministry.				
We need to encourage young people from our parish and school communities to be involved with our				
Parish. Parent Youth Leaders are needed to join in some youth group activities. WWC Registration compulsory.				
Fundraising and Social Committee Parish social events such as the annual fete are very important; they				
build community and help raise funds to pay for our parish centre and church buildings as well as other				
pastoral needs. Is your gift fundraising? Perhaps you have some ideas. Let us know.				
St Vincent De Paul Society is a Catholic organisation founded to assist the needy in our community. This				
assistance takes the form of food parcels, clothing and furniture. The local Conference meet monthly.				
Parish Morning Teas are a great way for the community to gather and get to know one another. A team				
prepares for morning tea by setting up and coordinating the clean up afterwards. Everyone is welcome to				
bring a plate of food to these gatherings				
Piety Store Attendants help in selling religious items and books in St Monica's Piety Store.				
Attends the Piety store before after the Mass has ended. Ministers will be rostered depending on Mass				
times.				
Prayer Support for the Parish Ask and you shall receive. (Mt 7:7) In response to Jesus' words, and in				
communion with the angels and saints, parishioners are invited and encouraged to spend time in front of the				
Blessed Sacrament or in the privacy of your home, to pray earnestly for the needs of the Parish, parishioners and for the universal needs of all people.				
Men's Shed gives men in the Parish a safe and friendly environment to come together to laugh, talk and				
sometimes work and/or pray together.				
Social Justice Group works to build a just society so that all people can live to their full potential. How?

inequality, prejudice and exclusion.
